

What is high school dual enrollment (HSDE)?

GCPS students have the opportunity to earn college credits from Garrett College while they are still enrolled in high school. The courses listed on the back of this page will allow students to satisfy high school requirements while also receiving college credit.

Why dual enrollment?

- Increase the likelihood to attend and complete college
- Be better prepared for college both academically and socially
- Save money on college tuition

When are HSDE courses offered?

GCPS students have the opportunity to enroll in courses beginning in their freshman year of high school. Please see the back of this flyer for additional information on what courses are available.

Where are courses offered?

Courses are offered through a variety of methods:

- In person at the high school (taught by Garrett College instructors)
- In person at the high school (taught by GCPS teachers)
- Garrett College campus
- Online (synchronous and asynchronous)

How do I enroll?

Students should indicate interest in HSDE courses while preparing their high school schedules with their Guidance Counselors. Students may need to complete placement testing, unless waived. Testing is offered at the high schools or at GC throughout the year. To begin the registration process, a student should complete the High School Dual Enrollment application found here:
